Berri features a gorgeous riverfront with plenty of area for picnics or playing sport and also includes floating wharf platforms, lookouts, historic monuments and an indigenous bridge mural. The town is situated on the banks of the Murray River right in the heart of the Riverland and is a good base for visiting other Riverland towns within 45 minutes of Berri.

Berri was originally part of Cobdogla Station and a mooring place for paddle steamers. The town of Berri takes its name from the Aboriginal word 'bery bery' meaning 'bend in the river' and was proclaimed in 1911.

Berri is surrounded by over 3000 hectares of irrigated orchards and has become notable as a fruit processing town. A large percentage of canned fruit and juice come from Berri.

It There are many things to do in the Berri area including excellent fishing, Lock 4, Lookout Tower, Martin Bend, Berri Limited (producer of the famous Berri fruit juices and many other famous products), Berri Estates (the largest winery in Australia) and Bella Lavender Estate, Lavender Farm.

Speakers



Mr Tim Whetstone MP State Member for Chaffey

Tim Whetstone's family moved to the city when he was young, after being born on a farming property at Keith.

Tim started as a fitter and turner at Holden after school and worked his way up to be a Project Manager in the Moomba gas fields while developing his own business building and restoring muscle cars and boats.

Tim moved back to the country and settled in the Riverland in 1989 where he started his citrus and winegrape business.

Tim was elected to the board of the Renmark Irrigation Trust in 1998 and has been working to secure a better deal on water for food producers since that time.

Nine years ago, Tim helped re-form South Australian Murray Irrigators (SAMI) and until recently held the role of Chairman. During that time Tim has been fighting to help the people of the South Australia get their fair share of water.

Tim has been a keen supporter of capturing and re-using stormwater across the State to help remove Adelaide's reliance on the Murray.

Tony Sharley

20 years experience in brokering environmental partnerships between the public and private sector. successful in securing State, Commonwealth and private funding for major environmental and ecotourism developments.

Former elected Board Member of Ecotourism Australia in 2003 and 2004.

Presented at 3 National Ecotourism Australia Conferences in 2004, 2005 and 2006. Member of the Riverland Biosphere Inc. committee (Chair in 2006 and 2007)

Manager of Banrock Station for 10 years (1999 to 2009) and directed \$5m worth of corporate sponsorship to community based environmental projects in 13 countries. Led Banrock Station through the Nationally Accredited Eco-Certification process. prepared successful proposals to the State Tourism Commission for an 8 km Banrock Station Walking Trail including an 800 metre boardwalk, bird hides, information huts, story centres (20,000 walkers spending ave. \$20 per visit).

Berri Golf Course is a favourite in the Riverland with beautifully presented grass greens. The men's par 71, 6019m and ladies par 73, 5284m Berri golf course is forgiving for the less experienced, yet challenging for committed golfers wanting to test their skills.

The par three opening hole is one of many highlights at this Riverland golf course. An elevated tee landscaped with roses and native shrubs plays up a slight rise to a magnificent green that's set among flowering tall gums. Around the course you'll discover that the fairways and greens at Berri are fully irrigated making for a very pleasant golfing experience. The par four eighth signature hole is challenging. In this instance you'll be required to avoid bunkers on both sides of the dance floor as you make your approach shot.
